What is an Immediate Denture?

An immediate denture is to avoid the situation of being without teeth. What this means is that once your permanent teeth are extracted, then your denture is inserted immediately afterwards while you go through the healing process.

This involves taking impressions of your mouth while your natural teeth are still present. We would then fabricate a denture in the likeness of your natural teeth or make any necessary modifications you may wish.

Here are some things that you should know about Immediate Dentures: As healing occurs, the oral tissues recede so denture adjustments may be required. Follow-up appointments are necessary. To maintain the best fit and comfort a temporary liner or tissue conditioner may be placed in the denture. During the next few months, bone gum and tissue will probably continue to shrink to some degree; however, the rate of change decreases with time. This is a natural occurrence which is to be expected. After the healing process is complete either a reline or a rebase may be required to ensure the most comfortable fit possible.

Denture Tips



Do you have a spare set of dentures and don't know how to store them? Well, dentures should always be kept moist when you aren't wearing them. So rather than just tucking them away in a drawer somewhere, why not put them in a Ziploc container filled with water and store them in your freezer. This will prevent them from drying out and losing their shape. Just remember to label them, as you don't want to pull them out for dinner one night! Also, never place your dentures in hot water as this can cause them to warp and change its shape.
